CHURCH PLANTER TO ADDRESS CONFERENCE MONDAY



Rockford, Ill church planter Samuel Sarpiya will preach Monday evening on the theme, “We Are a Gift With a Promise.”

Sarpiya was born in Jos, Nigeria, lived for some time in South Africa and Hawaii, and currently resides in Rockford, Ill. For the past two years he has concentrated his skills on planting a Church of the Brethren in Rockford, Ill. While living in South Africa and Hawaii he was involved with the group, “Youth With a Mission.” In addition to his church planting he serves as part-time staff for On Earth Peace. His vision for the Rockford community is best expressed as “Rockford Beyond Racism, Poverty, and Violence.” He also directs an all volunteer project, “Rockford Partners For Excellence,” currently working at the West Middle School in Rockford.

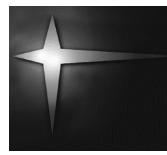
