2. Report of the Leadership Team

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The Leadership Team provides general oversight of Annual Conference and ex-
ecutive leadership for the committees of Annual Conference. It also acts as a li-
aison between the Annual Conference and the Church of the Brethren, Inc.3Members of the Leadership Team are the Annual Conference Officers (Modera-
tor, Moderator-elect, and Secretary), the General Secretary, a district executive
representing the Council of District Executives, and the director of Annual Con-
ference, serving ex officio.3

Some of the primary tasks are serving as an executive committee for Annual11Conference, delegating tasks from Conference actions, interpreting Conference12decisions and denominational polity, and providing general oversight for Annual13nual Conference in consultation with the Program and Arrangements Committee and the director of Annual Conference.15

In preparation for the 2022 Annual Conference, the Leadership Team spent considerable time finalizing recommendations about polity related to the three agencies that have an official relationship with Annual Conference—Bethany Theological Seminary, Eder Financial, and On Earth Peace. That work included a final consultation with leaders from those agencies and a conversation with the Council of District Executives. The Leadership Team also led a hearing on the topic at Annual Conference. 23

In April, the Leadership Team met with the Council of District Executives at the Church of the Brethren General Offices in Elgin, Ill., to reflect together on their common work and ministry. It was an uplifting and encouraging time to experience renewal, strengthen relationships, and explore ways district and denominational leadership work together.

The Leadership Team prepared a study on "Doing Annual Conference Differ-
ently" for conversation with the 2022 Standing Committee.3132

Following up actions of the 2022 Annual Conference, the Leadership Team in-
corporated the polity changes into the Manual of Organization and Polity and
sent assignments to the study committees appointed to work on two business
items, "Breaking Down Barriers: Increasing Access to Denominational Events"34
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After 10 years of exceptional service as Annual Conference Secretary, Jim Beck-40with worked with the newly called secretary, David Shumate, and the Leadership41Team to finalize minutes and business items and assist with the transition.42

Part of the work of the Leadership Team is to "coordinate denominational envisioning and assume responsibility for how denominational vision shall be implemented, giving consideration to emphasizing a unified vision among de-46

- 1 nomination, districts, and congregations."¹ With that in mind, the Leadership
