Opening Worship, Monday, September 1, 2025

Meditation

"Don't ask what the world needs. Ask what makes you come alive, and go do it. Because what the world needs is people who have come alive."-Howard Thurman

Call to Worship	[2 readers at pulpit]
Voice 1:	We've come from the East and the West, the coastlands, and the valleys, the cities and the suburbs.
Voice 2:	We've come from the North and the South, the great plains and the mountains, the small towns and country farms.
Voice 1:	We've come from places near and far to create a week-long community where we will live and learn, pray and play together.
Voice 2:	Some of us come from places of pain and stress, from paths of struggle and sorrow.
Voice 1:	Some of us come from places of joy and celebration, from paths of comfort and caring.
Voice 2:	All of us come seeking God's presence in this time of change.
Voice 1:	We come with some apprehension and fear about the future.
Voice 2:	We come wondering what will become of the Church we love.
Voice 1:	We come open to the movement of the Spirit among us this week.
Voice 2:	Come now to this place, and this time, to worship!
Voice 1:	To sing and to pray, and to dance with the Spirit!
Voice 2:	God brings us together for worship, holding our hopes and our fears, our dreams and our longings. Come, let us worship! ¹

Opening Prayer (together)

Holy Spirit, Breath of God,

come and make your presence known to us this week.

Come to us in the natural beauty of this place.

Come to us as we listen and learn.

Come to us through scripture, songs, and stories.

Come to us through the community of old friends and friends yet to be made.

Come to us now in this time of worship. Amen.²

Land Acknowledgement

As we begin NOAC please join me in making a land acknowledgement. I invite you to think about a piece of land that you love - maybe it's a garden you tend, or the yard around your house, or a park you like to visit or a favorite place to camp or even the median on a busy city street where a beautiful tree is growing. Think of that place and imagine yourself there.

Now imagine the people who have come before you who also know and love that place. Think of the other living beings who spend time there and depend on that land. How would it feel if you were told you could never go back to that place? Sit with that feeling for a moment. [pause]

As we gather near the waters of Lake Junaluska, we acknowledge that this place is part of the ancestral homelands of the East band of Cherokee, the S'atsoyaha (Yuchi) and Miccosukee peoples, who have stewarded these mountains and waters for generations beyond memory.

We know that the people of these lands experienced great loss when colonizers arrived and claimed this land for their purposes and profits. We recognize that we are part of an ongoing reality that displaces Indigenous peoples and has attempted to erase their memory and knowing of these lands.

This moment is an invitation - not just to reflect here, but to carry this awareness home. [While NOAC is just beginning], In five days each of us will return to different lands across Turtle Island (North America). Before we part, consider: "What is one way I can learn about the Indigenous peoples of the lands where I live, work, or worship?" May this question travel home with you [and throughout this week]. And may it grow into action.

In closing I invite you to recall again the land that you love... may your love extend to recognize the sacredness of all land and may our actions flow from that breadth of love. May it be so.
