Haiti: Agricultural Mini-Grants \$25,400.00

*Walking with L'Eglise des Freres (Church of the Brethren in Haiti) agronomists and building upon work begun by Brethren Disaster Ministries during its Earthquake response to provide small grants for eighteen communities involved with water systems, livestock watering ponds, seed banks, grain mills and passing on the gift goat projects*

Honduras : Lenca Indian Micro Credit Program \$12,500.00

*Small livestock passing on the gift project with Proyecto Aldea Global*

Niger: Gardening Well Project \$15,000.00

*Ten garden wells dug to provide water for gardening and livestock in the dry season with Nagarta Water for Life*

Nigeria: Improved Seeds and Poultry Initiative \$10,000.00

*Partnering with Ekklesiyar Yan'uwu a Nigeria's Rural Development Program staff to serve farmers with quality seeds, feeds, and vaccinated poultry.*
